Ambulatory Medication & Immunization Changes

Change: Effective, November 8, 2019- Ambulatory Medications (Vaccine and Non-Vaccine Meds) will have different options to select on the documentation task screen.

This change does not apply to Oncology clinics

Immunizations

- Each dropdown is now labeled per the vaccine being given.
- Users will now see different choices in the **Vaccine Charge** and the **Vaccine Admin Charge** dropdowns, that apply specifically to the vaccine being given.
 - For Vaccine Admin Charge: If selecting the **Counseling Admin** codes, if the vaccines is a multi-component vaccine, users will select the appropriate choice according to how many components are within the vaccine.*

Vaccine Admin DTaP Pediatric Under 7yrs:

- First Inj Vaccine 90471
- Subs Inj Vaccine 90472
- Counsel <19yrs, 1 Comp Vacc 904
- Counsel <19yrs, 2 Comps Vacc 904
- Counsel <19yrs, 3 Comps Vacc 904
- VFC First Inj Vaccine (90471)
- VFC Subs Inj Vaccine (90472)
- VFC Counsel <19yrs, 1 Comp Vacc
- VFC Counsel <19yrs, Both Comps
- VFC Counsel <19yrs, All 3 Comps

Medications

- Users will see less choices in the **Medication Charge** and **Med Admin Charge** dropdowns.
 - For example, if the med is a 150mg order, the only choice for the med will be 150mg, plus the option to indicate the patient supplied their own medication.*

Medroxyprogesterone (Depo Provera) Vial:

- Depo Provera 150 mg J1050
- Patient Supplied Medroxyprogesterone

AMB Med Admin:

- “Vial Size NA” field: The description of the field previously indicated “Option Not Available”. This field is to be used if you have a vial/dosage that is not listed in the dropdown for selection. If so, enter it into this field.
